


Two little kitties left all alone Without a home to call their own. Two little kitties beside the road Two tiny hearts with a heavy load.

As day changed to night Their hearts filled with fright With no place to sleep


They started to weep.

Stop little kitties and dry your eyes Answers will come to anyone who tries. If you just think with all your might You'll get through this long dark night.






Into the culvert they both fled A scary place without a bed No soft pillow for either little head Nor a dish so the two would be happily fed

Stopping in his tracks, he heard a tiny cry As two little kitties under the culvert did fly.





Up in the trees they climbed so high And tried their best to touch the sky. Birds flew by and chirped their name While big busy bumblebees did the same.


